STORY LINES

- Coming off a 33-30 overtime win over Western Michigan, UNT heads into Saturday's contest against Washington St. with a 2-0 record for the second consecutive season. It is the first time since the 1989-90 seasons the Mean Green have started 2-0 in back-to-back years.
- Under first-year DC **Skyler Cassity**, the Mean Green defense held Lamar to just 119 yards of total offense in the season opener, the fewest in program history since 1992, and rank fifth in FBS in total defense (187.0) and fourth in passing defense (81.5)
- Saturday's win over WMU is UNT's first win after trailing by 14 or more points at any time in the 2nd half since Oct. 16, 2012 against Louisiana. It was also the first time in program history the Mean Green won a game despite not leading at any point during regulation.
- Redshirt freshman QB **Drew Mestemaker** won the starting job in the offseason despite arriving at UNT as a walk-on who had not started a game at QB since ninth grade. Mestemaker has averaged 276.5 passing yards per game to start 2025, good for 17th in FBS and second in the American.
- The shutout against Lamar was the first shutout for UNT since Oct. 30, 2003 vs. Troy (21-0), first shutout in a season opener since Sept. 1, 1994 vs. ACU (48-0) and the most lopsided shutout since Oct. 1, 1988 vs. E. Washington (51-0).
- North Texas finished the 2024 season as the third-ranked total offense in the country averaging 488.8 total yards per game while also ranking fourth in passing offense (328.2 YPG) and 23rd in scoring offense (33.5 ppg). UNT was one of only nine programs to sit in the top-25 in FBS in those three categories.
- In each of his first two seasons at the helm, Morris has produced a UNT offense that finished inside the top six in total offense. Since becoming the offensive coordinator at Texas Tech in 2013, Morris has led an offense that finished inside the top 25 in scoring and top-10 in total offense (FBS or FCS) nine times in 12 years.
- In the offseason, UNT hired DC Cassity after a successful one-year stint in the same role at Sam Houston. In 2024, Cassity led a pass defense that ranked 11th in the nation while forcing 22 turnovers, the 16th-most in FBS. The Bearkats were also one of only four non-P4 teams to give up less than 20.0 points per game.
- The 30 total points allowed by the UNT defense is the fewest points allowed through the first two games of a season since the 2002 (27 PA). The Mean Green went on to win the Sun Belt Conference and New Orleans Bowl in '02.
- For the second straight season, UNT was met with a large roster turnover with 68 new players on the roster in 2025, the fourth-most in FBS. In addition, North Texas' portal class of 51 players is the second largest in FBS. Despite this, UNT has 465 career NCAA games started on its roster, the most in the Morris era (2023 396, 2024 388).
- The 2025 schedule features seven games at home for the first time in program history.

MORE QUICK HITTERS

- The UNT offensive line comes into 2025 ranked inside the top 11 in FBS in combined games played (t-11th, 227) games played and games started (t-10th, 135).
- Prior to the season, HC Eric Morris named OL **Gabe Blair**, DL **Fatafehi Vailea** and P **Sawyer Evans** team captains for the 2025 season.
- North Texas has had a player with 10+ receiving touchdowns in each of the last three seasons joining Ohio State as one of only two FBS programs with that distinction.
- The Mean Green spread the wealth as total of 21 different players caught a pass for North Texas in 2024, tied for third-most in FBS. Of the 21, 10 return to the roster in 2025. The Mean Green have had eight or more players catch at least one pass in 26 of the 27 games of the Eric Morris era.
- Of the 27 games in the Morris era, nearly half (13) have seen UNT rack up 500+ yards of total offense.
- In the 16 American games in the Morris era, 10 have been decided by one score. UNT is 4-6 in those contests.

WASHINGTON STATE SERIES HISTORY

- The 2025 matchup between UNT and Washington State will be the first between the programs in history.
- It will be the third all-time meeting between the Mean Green and a PAC-12 opponent. The Mean Green are
 1-1 all-time against Oregon State, knocking off the Beavers in the lone contest in Denton 30-27 in 1995.

STRONG START ON DEFENSE

- The UNT defense under first-year defensive coordinator Skyler Cassity has been dominant in the first two games of the 2025 season.
- North Texas has allowed 187.0 yards per game defensively, good for rank fifth in the country. Through the air, UNT is even better giving up just 81.5 passing yards per game to sit fourth in FBS.
- The 30 total points allowed by the UNT defense is the fewest points allowed through the first two games of a season since the 2002 (27 PA). The Mean Green went on to win the Sun Belt Conference and New Orleans Bowl in '02.
- Down the stretch against Western Michigan, the Mean Green defense stood up strong. After falling behind 27-17 with 14:13 left in the fourth, UNT allowed a total of just four yards over WMU's final four drives of the game including the overtime period. Furthermore, the last drive of regulation and the lone drive of OT netted a total of -6 yards for Western Michigan.

- The season opener saw North Texas shutout an opponent for the first time in nearly 22 years. The Mean Green blanked Lamar 51-0 for the first shutout since routing Troy 21-0 on Oct. 30, 2003.
- It was UNT's first shutout of an opponent in a season opener since a 48-0 win over ACU on Sept. 1, 1994 and the largest margin of victory in a shutout since taking down Eastern Washington 51-0 on Oct. 1, 1988.
- The Mean Green defense held Lamar to just 119 total yards, the fewest allowed by UNT since giving up 95 against Abilene Christian on Sept. 5, 1992. In addition, the 31 yards rushing yards allowed was the seventh fewest allowed in a game since 2000.

OFFENSIVE MASTERMIND

- UNT head coach **Eric Morris** is one of the top offensive minds in the country, proven by a stellar track record over 12 seasons as an offensive coordinator and head coach.
- In each of his first two seasons at the helm, North Texas offense has ranked inside the top six in total offense (2023-6th, 2024-3rd), inside the top 12 in passing (2023-12th, 2024-4th) and inside the top 23 in scoring (2023-21st, 2024-23rd).
- Since becoming the offensive coordinator at Texas Tech in 2013 Morris has led an offense that finished inside the top 25 (FBS or FCS) in scoring nine times in 12 years.
- In addition, Morris has led offenses that finished in the top-10 in total offense nine times, including the top FBS offense (Texas Tech) in 2016 and the top FCS offense (UIW) in the nation in 2020.
- Morris-led offenses have been dominant through the air as eight of Morris' first 12 years as an OC or HC have resulted in a top-five passing offense in the country.
- In Morris' 27 games as head coach at North Texas, the offense has eclipsed 500 yards on 13 occasions, including six times in 2024, the second-most of any head coach in UNT history (Seth Littrell, 23 in 88 games).
- For perspective, North Texas had just 20 games with 500+ yards of total offense in the five seasons prior to Morris' arrival. UNT is 9-4 when surpassing 500 yards of offense under Morris.

MESTE (PLAY) MAKER

- North Texas named **Drew Mestemaker**, a redshirt freshman from Vandegrift, Texas, as the starting quarterback prior to the season.
- At Vandegrift HS, Mestemaker served as the backup quarterback and played safety while also punting. Prior to coming to North Texas, he had not started a game at QB since he was a freshman in high school on the B-team in 2020.
- Through his final three years at Vandegrift, the walk-on QB served as the backup to now-Louisville QB Duece Adams in 2023 and Baylor baseball catcher Brayden Buchanan in 2022 and 2021.
- Despite the lack of recruiting pedigree, Mestemaker won the backup QB job and earned his first career start in the SERVPRO First Responder Bowl last season.
- He put in a stellar performance in the bowl game that saw him rack up 448 yards of total offense, tied for the most of any player in the 2024-25 bowl cycle. He finished 26 of 41 for 393 yards and two touchdowns while rushing nine times for 55 yards, including a 70-yard TD run.
- Mestemaker's 393 passing yards were the second-most by a QB in his starting debut since 2000 in program history while his 55 rushing yards was the fourth-most in that span.
- Mestemaker is off and running in 2025, averaging 276.5 passing yards per game, good for 18th in FBS.

GETTING TO 3-0

- UNT heads into Saturday's contest against Washington St. with a 2-0 record for the second consecutive season. It is the first time since the 1989-90 seasons the Mean Green have started 2-0 back-to-back years.
- A win over Wazzu would push North Texas to 3-0 for just the eighth time in program history and the first time since 2018. UNT has started 3-0 in 2018, 1989, 1966, 1959, 1951, 1920 and 1919.
- In the first seven seasons with a 3-0 record, UNT went on to win three conference titles (1966, 1959, 1951).

STACKED WR ROOM

- The North Texas wide receiver room has a wealth of talent with contributions from both returners and key portal pieces.
- UNT returns six players who caught double-digit passes a season ago, including sophomores **Miles Coleman** and **Wyatt Young** along with junior **Landon Sides**.
- Young has led the receiving core in the early going with eight catches for 156 yards and two touchdowns.
- Coleman closed his freshman campaign with 18 catches for 161 yards and two touchdowns in the final three games of the season. He has seven catches for 64 yards through two games in 2025.
- The Mean Green also added veteran transfer pass catchers **Cameron Dorner** (Shepherd), **Simeon Evans** (Sam Houston) and TE **Tre Williams III** (Limestone).
- Evans earned Honorable Mention All-CUSA honors, Dorner had over 700 receiving yards and Williams was a DII All-American in 2024. Dorner has had the largest impact through two games with a team-high nine catches for 117 yards and a pair of scores.
- The Mean Green have had eight or more players catch at least one pass in 26 of the 27 games of the Eric Morris era.

RUNNING (IT) BACK

- Sophomore RB Makenzie McGill II has proven to have a nose for the endzone as he is up to 12 rushing touchdowns in his career through 15 games played.
- McGill, who closed the 2024 season with 78 carries for 502 yards and 10 touchdowns, is the only returning running back in the American who logged double-digit rushing TDs in 2024.
- The sophomore RB has picked up right where he left off, scoring rushing touchdowns in each of the first two games of 2025, including the game-winner in OT against WMU. McGill's 12 touchdowns in the last two seasons are the most among non-P4 running backs in that span.
- McGill is one of only 11 RBs who had 10+ rushing TDs to return to the team he played for in 2024 along with Notre Dame's Jeremiah Love, Penn State's Nick Singleton and Texas A&M's Le'Veon Moss among others. He joins San Jose State's Floyd Chalk IV as one of only two non-power 4 RBs to stake that claim.

SKY'S THE LIMIT

- In the offseason, North Texas brought in Defensive Coordinator **Skyler Cassity** after a successful oneyear stint in the same role at Sam Houston.
- In 2024, Cassity led Sam Houston's 11th-ranked pass defense while forcing 22 turnovers, the 16th-most in FBS in 2024. The Bearkats were also one of only four Group of Five teams to give up 20.0 points per game or less last season.
- Upon arrival at Sam Houston, Cassity inherited a 3-9 defense which he immediately turned into a 9-3 team for 2024. The program became bowl eligible for the first time.
- The Bearkats ranked eighth in possession stop rate at 73.8%, 14th in red zone defense and 12th fourthdown defense. In CUSA, Cassity's defense was top five in every category and led the league in scoring defense, passing defense, passing defensive efficiency, red zone defense and interceptions.
- Prior to Sam Houston, Cassity spent two seasons, 2022-23, as Abilene Christian's defensive coordinator.

- In addition, Mestemaker is the only one of that group to not be ranked by any of the major services and the only former walk on to earn the starting job.

BEARKATS MEAN GREEN

- In addition to a new defensive staff, Cassity also helped bring six players from Sam Houston in the transfer portal, five of which are on the defensive side of the ball.
- The defensive additions are CB **Da'Veawn Armstead**, LB **S'Maje Burrell**, LB **Trey Fields**, CB **David Fisher** and **DL Richard Outland Jr.** who all played 10+ games for the Bearkats last fall.
- All five defensive additions appear on the two-deep while Armstead, Fields, Fisher and Outland all started against Western Michigan.
- Fields serves as the quarterback of the defense after starting 12 games at linebacker for the Bearkats in 2024. The senior out of Danciger, Texas, produced 80 tackles and 6.0 TFLs in 2024 and has kicked off his UNT career in a big wway with an interception in the opener and 11 tackles vs. WMU.
- In the secondary, Fisher and Armstead were the starting corners for 11 of Sam Houston's 13 games. The duo combined for 67 tackles, 3.0 TFLs, 11 PBUs and a pair of interceptions on the year.
- Along the defensive front, Outland Jr. started 11 games in 2024 and was a space stuffer in the middle with 5.5 TFLs and 3.0 sacks. He added another TFL against Lamar in his first game in a UNT uniform.
- UNT also added WR **Simeon Evans** who was an Honorable Mention All-CUSA selection in 2024 after catching 50 passes for 559 yards and six touchdowns.
- In total, the six transfers from Sam Houston have combined for 195 games played with 79 total starts.

LINEBACKER CORE

- The Mean Green LB room looks poised for a breakout season with the return of senior **Shane Whitter** and junior **Ethan Wesloski** along with the addition of senior transfer **Trey Fields**.
- Last season, Wesloski produced 57 tackles, the second-most among returning players, 5.0 TFLs and 2.5 sacks a season ago while Whitter added 49 tackles, 1.5 TFLs and three PBUs.
- Wesloski has been stellar through two games with 13 tackles and 3.0 tackles for loss, tied for the 6th-most TFLs in the American. He had the biggest play of the night against Lamar when he produced a TFL, forced a fumble and recovered it in the endzone for UNT's first defensive touchdown since 2022.
- Fields, meanwhile, had a spectacular season at Sam Houston with 80 tackles, 6.0 TFLs and a pair of PBUs. He had started his North Texas career off with a bang grabbing an interception in the opener and producing 11 tackles against Western Michigan.
- Whitter, meanwhile, is coming off the best game of his career with a game-high 12 tackles, including seven solo stops, against Western Michigan.

- Junior transfer DL **Ethan Day** had an impressive start in a UNT uniform, registering a sack in each of the first two games of 2025. He is one of only seven players in the American to have multiple sacks and is tied for second among DL in the league with 11 tackles this season.
- In the season opener against Lamar, Day also added a career best five total tackles including his first full sack as an FBS player.
- Originally from Ripon, CA., Day started his career at Modesto Community College in 2022 before transferring to Wyoming in 2023. He posted 19 tackles, a TFL, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery last season with the Cowboys.

FAMILIARITY WITH WAZZU

- While North Texas and Washington State have never met on the field, there is some familiarity between the Cougars and the Mean Green tied to UNT head coach Eric Morris.
- Morris has spent two seasons in Pullman on the coaching staff for WSU in a pair of separate one-year stints. He was the offensive coordinator for Wazzu in 2022 and served as the inside WRs coach under the late Mike Leach in 2022.
- In addition, two members of the North Texas offensive staff were also with Morris in 2022 as UNT OC **Jordan Davis** served as an analyst while UNT QBs coach **Sean Brophy** was a graduate assistant.

MESTIE'S BESTIE

- Starting QB Drew Mestemaker and WR Miles Coleman have had a connection going back to their respective youth leagues when they played together in Austin, Texas.
- The duo continued the friendship on and off the field into high school where they played together at Vandegrift HS in Northwest Austin, Texas. Their senior year in 2023, the Vipers went 10-0 in the regular season and won the 6A District 25 title.
- Now together on the field in college, Coleman and Mestemaker have continued that connection. In three games with Mestemaker as the starting QB, they have combined for 13 completions for 168 yards and a touchdown.

ELITE COMPANY IN THE END ZONE

- North Texas has had a player with 10+ receiving touchdowns in each of the last three seasons joining Ohio State as one of only two FBS programs with that distinction.
- The UNT receiving core has seen DT Sheffield (2024), Ja'Mori Maclin (2023) and Jyaire Shorter (2022) each rack up 11 receiving TDs in each of the last three seasons. The Mean Green will look to continue the trend in 2025, returning six players who had double digit receptions from last season.
- WRs **Wyatt Young** and **Cameron Dorner** look to have the edge in the early race to double digit TDs for the Mean Green, both with two scores through two games.
- The Buckeyes, meanwhile, have seen Emeka Egbuka (2022 & 2024), Marvin Harrison Jr. (2022 & 2023) and Jeremiah Smith (2024) all eclipse 10+ TDs in the last three seasons.

QUARTERBACK WHISPERER

- UNT head coach Eric Morris has had a knack for finding under-the-radar talent at the quarterback position and turning them into elite players at their position.
- In his time coaching, Morris has had the opportunity to recruit and mentor future NFL quarterbacks **Case Keenum** (Houston, 2010-11), **Baker Mayfield** (Texas Tech, 2013), **Davis Webb** (Texas Tech, 2013-15), **Patrick Mahomes** (Texas Tech, 2014-16) and **Cam Ward** (UIW, 2020-21)
- Of the top quarterbacks listed above, none of them were ranked higher than a three star as a recruit by any
 of the major services, highlighted by providing the only collegiate offer to Heisman finalist and future 2025
 NFL No. 1 overall pick Cam Ward.
- Also of note, when Morris was the offensive coordinator at Washington State he extended the only P4 offer to now Oklahoma QB and Heisman Trophy candidate John Mateer out of High School.

IN THE SECONDARY

- As is the case for a majority of the defense, the secondary looks to be improved in 2025 thanks to the return of key contributors along with an influx of transfer portal impact players.
- The secondary has certainly stood out through two games allowing just 81.5 passing yards per game and an opponent completion percentage of 46.2, both of which rank fourth in FBS.
- Junior S **Evan Jackson** is the top returning tackler for UNT after racking up 59 a season ago. He also had three interceptions and a pair of PBUs.
- Sophomore **Quinton Hammonds** also returns after a breakout freshman campaign that saw him produce 52 tackles and an interception. The former walk-on from Allen, Texas, was recruited as a WR out of high school but flourished on the defensive side of the ball for UNT in 2024.
- North Texas also landed projected contributors Will Jones II, David Fisher, Da'Veawn Armstead, Jackson Lataimua and Patrick Smith-Young in the portal.
- Jones joined the Mean Green with a wealth of experience having played 44 games with 22 starts across six seasons at Kansas State, USF and Old Dominion.
- Fisher and Armstead both arrive after starting 11+ games at CB for Sam Houston a season ago while Lataimua played in 33 games and started 13 in three seasons at Washington State.
- Smith-Young returned to Denton after a one year hiatus at ODU. In 2023 at UNT, Smith-Young appeared in 12 games with seven starts and was second on the team with 77 tackles. He had eight tackles (four solo) in the win over Western Michigan.

BIG MEN UP FRONT

- After starting 10 different offensive line combinations in 13 games a season ago, North Texas looks to take a step forward on the OL in 2025.
- The unit returns three players who started 6+ games in 2025, led by sophomore **Braydon Nelson** who made 11 starts in his freshman season and earned PFF All-True Freshman team honors.
- The Mean Green also return Larry Moore III and Johnny Dickson III who both started six games a season ago.
- Also returning for his senior campaign is Gabe Blair who missed the 2024 season due to injury. A stalwart previously in the lineup, Blair earned Second Team All-American Conference honors in 2023 and has started 37 games on the offensive line in his career.
- UNT also brought in a number of transfer offensive linemen in the offseason, including projected starters **Ugonna Nnanna**, **Jimto Obidegwu** and **Tay Yanta II**.
- The trio of Nnanna, Obidegwu and Yanta have all seen action in at least 30 games in their careers. Yanta arrived with 37 starts under his belt from his time at ACU, Obidegwu made 23 starts in time at Kent State and Temple while Nnanna started nine games across his last two seasons at Virginia.
- The UNT offensive line came into 2025 ranked inside the top 11 in FBS in combined games played (t-11th, 227) games played and games started (t-10th, 135).

KICKIN' IT WITH KALI

- Sophomore K Kali Nguma has had a strong start to his UNT career kicking for the Mean Green.
- Last season, Nguma went 11 for 16 in field goals with a long of 46 yards and matched a school record by going a perfect 55 for 55 in extra points. He nailed both of his FG attempts vs. WMU, including a 25-yarder that tied the game with less than two minutes remaining to send the contest to OT.
- Nguma has started a perfect 9-for-9 in XPs this season to push his career total to 64, good for seventhmost in program history.
- In the extra point category, UNT kickers have still not missed a PAT in two seasons under Eric Morris. Kickers have combined to connect on 126 consecutive PATs dating back to Oct. 29, 2022 against WKU.

GETTING IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM

- As they have been throughout Eric Morris' tenure at North Texas, the Mean Green have excelled in the classroom.
- In the spring 2025 semester, UNT posted a team GPA of 3.252. It was the second-highest semester GPA in program history and the highest spring semester team GPA in program history.
- · Additionally, 15 players have on the roster have already received their college degrees.
- Simeon Evans has been a standout in the classroom with a 3.82 cumulative GPA and earned the honor of being named UNT's nominee for the prestigious Campbell Trophy, given each year to the FBS player who stands out the most in both the classroom and on the field.

GAME 3 - WASHINGTON STATE

VETERAN PORTAL PRESENCE

- The UNT coaching staff went hunting for experienced players in the transfer portal in the offseason and found it in a big way, bringing in 20 players who have played in 20+ NCAA contests in their careers, 12 who have seen action in 30+ games and four who have played at least 36 games in their careers.
- The veteran presence is led by defensive starters LB **Trey Fields** (51 games) and S **Will Jones II** (45 games) who have both played in more than 40 contests in their collegiate careers.
- Of the 51 transfers who arrived at North Texas in the offseason with prior NCAA playing experience, 29 have played in at least 10 games and 14 have made 10+ starts, led by OL **Tay Yanta II** (37), CB **David Fisher** (28), WR **Tyrese Hunt-Thompson** (27), and QB **Reese Poffenbarger** (26) who have all made 25+ starts in their careers.
- Coming into the 2025 season, UNT has 465 career NCAA games started on its roster, the most in the Morris era (2023 - 396, 2024 - 388).

NARROW MARGINS IN THE AMERICAN

- UNT has become synonymous with close games during American play in their first two years in the league.
- In the first 16 league games in the America for the Mean Green, 10 of those contests have been decided by one score. UNT is 4-6 in those games, going 2-2 in one-score games in 2024 after finishing 2-4 in 2023.
- The 2023 schedule, Morris' first season at UNT, was littered with close matchups as it finished with eight games decided by one score or less, matching a program record for one-score games set in 1937.
- In total, the Mean Green have played 14 one-score games in less than three years under Coach Morris. UNT is 6-8 in those contests, but added a win to the category in the 33-30 OT victory over WMU.

NEW FACES EVERYWHERE

- UNT has 68 new players on the roster, trailing only Utah State, New Mexico and West Virginia for the fourth-most in all of FBS.
- A significant majority of those newcomers arrived via the transfer portal with North Texas adding 51 transfer prospects in the offseason, the second-most in the country.
- The new players on the roster do not lack playing time, however, with 29 of them having playing in at least 10 NCAA contests in their careers.
- The portal prospects are littered throughout the two-deep. In total, 30 (18 defense, 12 offense) of the 54 offensive and defensive players on the two deep are players that arrived via the portal this offseason.

ROLL THE DICE

- In the first two seasons of the Eric Morris era, the Mean Green have been one of the most aggressive teams in FBS.
- UNT finished 11th in fourth down attempts (36) in 2023 and led the country in 2024 with 44. They were also 6th in fourth down conversions in 2023 and seventh in 2024.
- The Mean Green are one of only five FBS programs with 36+ fourth down conversion attempts in each of the last two seasons (Arizona State, Baylor, Boston College, West Virginia).

STONE COLD CELEBRATION

- Starting in 2023, when the defense creates a turnover a "Stone Cold" celebration begins on the sidelines.
- In honor of WWE Superstar Steve Austin, who played linebacker and defensive end at North Texas in the 1980s, players bang together two bottles of water while holding a wrestling belt to mimic the famous celebration of "Stone Cold" Steve Austin.
- In the 2024 win over SFA, a video of Texada's interception celebration generated over 7.2 million views on social media over the first 24 hours after posting. "And that's the bottom line."

ON THE NATIONAL STAGE

- The 2024 season put North Texas on the national stage in a way never seen before in program history.
- The Mean Green played seven of their 13 games on linear TV a season ago, including being featured on ESPN for the First Responder Bowl. The previous record for most linear broadcasts for the Mean Green was five set in 2023.
- UNT also played back-to-back home games on ESPN2 against Tulane and Army last season, marking the first two ESPN2 broadcasts in DATCU Stadium history.
- The trend looks to continue in 2025 as four of the six scheduled broadcasts in 2025 are on linear networks, including Saturday's contest against Washington State on ESPNU.


